We posed that question to six of our seasoned Travel Specialists.


Here are their top recommendations....

### **Europe's Great Cities**

For a quintessential European experience, go to Rome, Florence and Venice. Venice is like one big, romantic, open-air museum. You have all the winding canals, the gondolas and the ancient art of glass-blowing. In Florence, the museums are incredible, and Rome is a hodgepodge of architectural ruins mixed with present-day bustle. When you go to a restaurant in Italy, the dining experience is almost ritualistic. I always recommend trying a family owned restaurant that makes its own wine. It's better than anything I've had anywhere in the world.

Don't leave home without: A shoulder-strap purse that you can wear across your chest under a jacket to deter pickpockets.

Don't leave home without: Your binoculars. That way you'll be ready when someone points out a breaching whale.


### **Our National Parks**

If you've never been to a national park, head west. I recommend an itinerary that starts off in the Grand Canyon and stops in Sedona, an eclectic little artist's colony near Red Rock State Park. You'll spend a day at Utah's Zion National Park with its tremendous white sandstone cliffs and nearby Bryce Canyon before continuing on through Salt Lake City and into Wyoming. There you have Grand Teton National Park, with some of North America's oldest rocks, and Yellowstone. Traveling into South Dakota, visit the Crazy Horse Monument and Mount Rushmore. With a trip like this, you're not just seeing wildlife, you're also visiting U.S. memorials. The landscape is gorgeous, and during summer nights, the sky looks like it's lit up with so many stars.

Don't leave home without: Sunscreen, bug spray and layers for evenings and higher elevations.

In all my travels, I've never seen any place as breathtaking as Tahiti's Bora Bora. The water is an unimaginable deep turquoise blue. I recommend bungalow accommodations at the Bora Bora Pearl Beach Resort. You'll wake up each morning to panoramic views of the lagoon and Mount Otemanu. From your balcony, you can watch the sea turtles and fish swim beneath you—or hop in the water and swim around with them. Schedule a motu picnic, a local feast at another island a quick boat ride away, on a picnic table in the water.

**Don't leave home without:** An underwater camera. When you go snorkeling, you can get amazing video or pictures with the reefs and the fish.

Visit museums or take an NBC studio tour.

On a 2-week Baltic Sea cruise, you don't need expensive tours or excursions to experience Scandinavian capitals like Copenhagen and Amsterdam. Just walking around, you have access to world-class museums and quaint cafés and restaurants. Most of the population speaks English as a second language, so it's easy to communicate. The cruises also dock at St. Petersburg, one of my favorite ports,

which is very different from the rest of Europe. Because the cruise ship usually spends 2 days there, you can really see it in depth. Be sure to sample authentic Russian cuisine; don't overlook *pierogi*, rectangular pies stuffed with traditional fillings like cabbage or apples.

Don't leave home without: Comfortable walking shoes, so your feet won't get sore and cramp

your style.
